A young veteran from Meridian, Idaho has decided it's time to bring our troops home.

Dan McKnight served in the Marine Corps Reserves and then three years active duty in the Army, then ten years with the Idaho Army National Guard. In 2006, he spent a year in Afghanistan.

He says we were there for the right reason, and we've there far too long for the wrong reasons.

He believes this is the perfect time for Idaho to lead the way and bring

"Now is a good time because we have a president who has shown an interest and willingness to bring our troops home from the wars," says McKnight.
